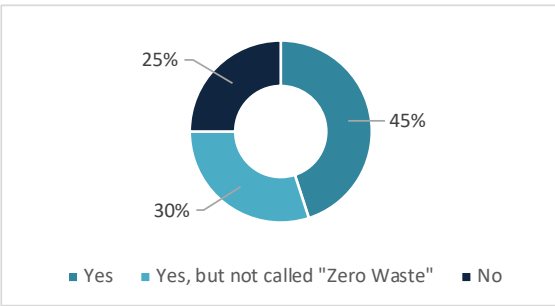


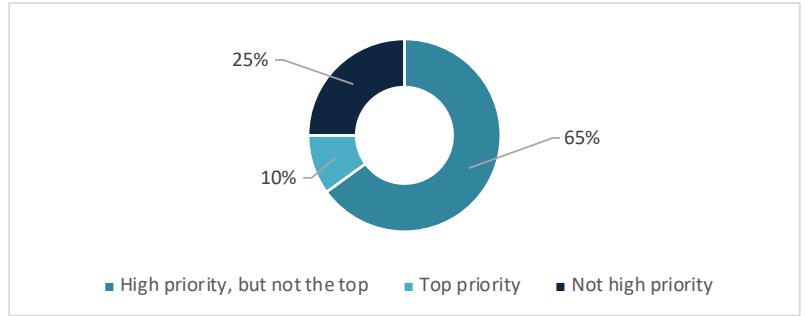

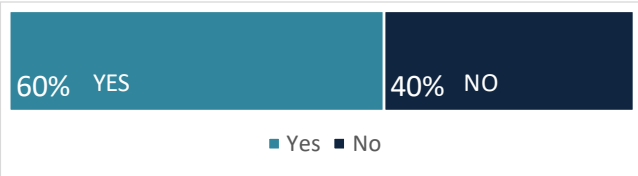
Do you currently have Zero Waste Strategy?

- > Waste reduction/ circular economy falls under two departments with one staff person in each doing some work in waste reduction but
- > We have 3 full time staff members that work in Waste Diversion but no official Zero Waste directive/policy

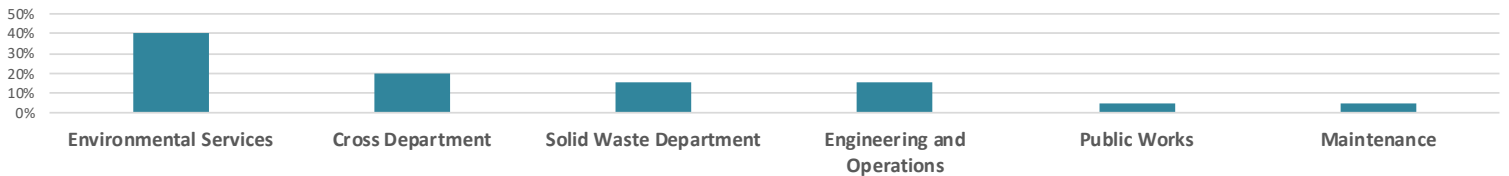
Do you have a budget for zero waste initiatives?



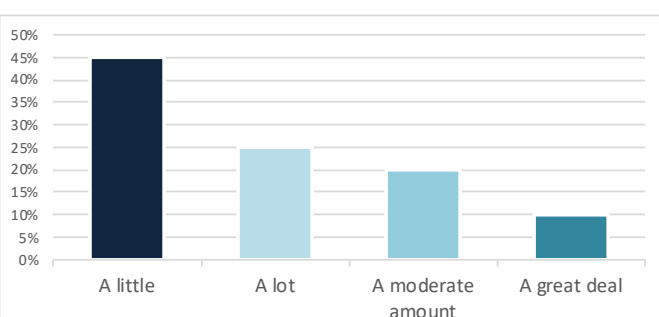
Details provided:

- > Costs are negligible and we spend what we need to spend.
- > General budget allocations at this time, more specific/targeted budgets will be developed to support our new SWMP implementation

- > We do not have a specific budget for ZW but do have budgets for related initiatives
- > We have a very limited budget and we are very isolated so makes it that much more challenging
- > We have a Waste Diversion budget but no specific zero waste initiatives

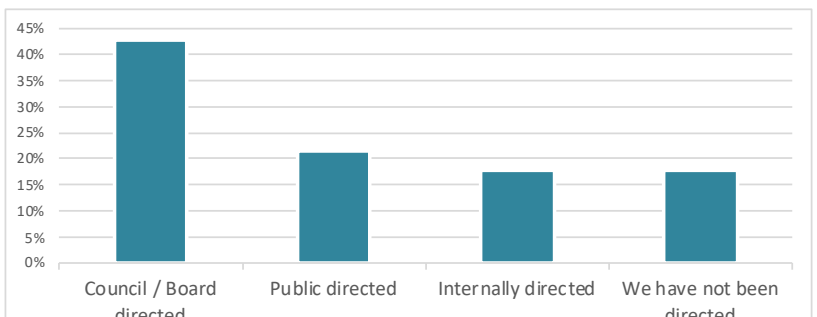
What function department of your organization has responsibility for waste reduction planning?



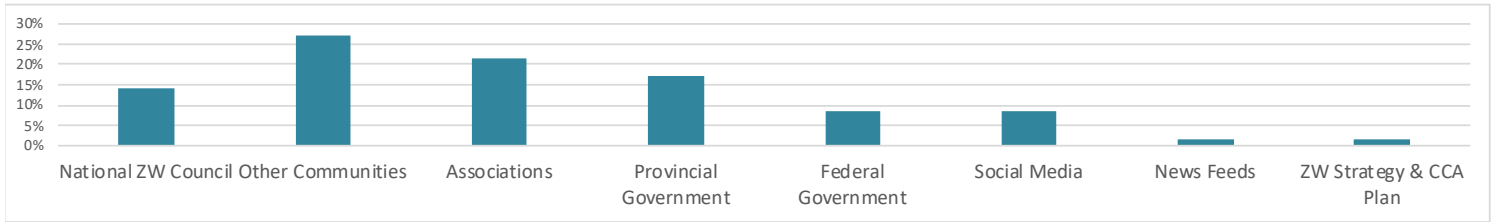
How much have you engaged with your residents related to zero waste programs?



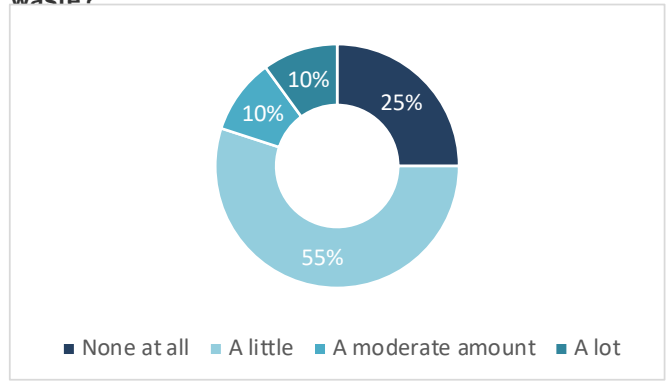
By whom have you been directed to address zero waste?

- > Source Separation bylaw for municipal solid waste

 - > Landfill bans
 - > Recyclable material bans at landfills
